

## **16-19 Tuition Fund Statement**

In line with the Government guidance, this statement outlines how HYA Training will utilise the 16-19 Tuition Fund in the 2021/2022 academic year.

The targeted and strategic use of this fund will reflect our mission, 'To provide a range of high-quality learning provision, meeting the individual needs of our local and wider community'.

### **What is the 16-19 Tuition Fund?**

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is ring-fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 institutions who receive annual funding allocations from ESFA for the provision of 16 to 19 education, to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

### **Who can be supported by this fund?**

The funding is to support small group tuition for students aged 16 to 19 in English, maths and other subjects that have been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning. Students aged 19 to 24 who have an education, health and care (EHC) plan are also eligible for support. All students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme and the funding should be used to support the tuition activity above and beyond the programmes of education already planned. It is for students who:

- Students who have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in GCSE maths and/or English.
- Students who have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged background and need catch-up support.

### **How will we determine the support required?**

We will complete a review of all students on an eligible programme of study and who meet the Government criteria and determine if they would benefit from additional support during 2021/2022 and, if so, what support is required. In line with Government guidance, HYA Training will prioritise those students who have not achieved a grade 4 in English and/or maths.

Individualised student tuition plans will then be created which will outline the plan of support each student will receive across the academic year.

### **How will support be provided?**

Support will be provided through small group intervention (with a maximum group size of 5 students), with tuition sessions scheduled in addition to the planned programme of study hours already timetabled for the academic year 2021/22. Tuition sessions will be delivered by existing teaching staff through face to face delivery model.

### **What support will be provided?**

To ensure that students are equipped with the key skills and knowledge required, it is crucial they have a good understanding of the key concepts of both English language and mathematical principles. Therefore, sessions will focus on developing the critical analysis, reading and numeracy skills required to make progress on their GCSE or Functional Skills course.
